


SKATEPARK CONSULTATION REPORT.


1. Age

Skateboarding is substantially the most popular sport identified, scooters and BMX also have a presence.






3. Skill Level


As of right now, the far majority of the future users consider themselves to be Intermediate.



From all participants' five choices, Staris/Gaps was basic obstacle by far most voted for. Grind Box and Rail where a close second.









5. Advanced Obstacle

With 34% and 23% there is a clear demand for a funbox and a set of stairs/gap as advanced obstacle.



6. Ramp

With 57% the Hip is the most popular ramp, closely followed by the vert wall (20%).





7. Voices from the Community

3. Final Design Revision

The small changes to the design as informed by community feedback are as such:

- 1. A lot of the old features have been included in the final concept design #9228 as most feedback stated that design #9225 was suitable and very desirable to ride.
- 2. The three humps have been transformed into a hump/box obstacle which will complement well the short distances between the vert wall and street set.
- 3. The vert wall has been reduced to 2.5m height and now is in better proportion to the scale of the skate park footprint.



4. Conclusion

Trinity Skate Parks is proud to present to the Sunshine Coast Council and the Maleny Skate Park Community the Final Concept Design #9228 for the proposed re-development of the current Maleny Skate Facility.
