Active Transport Link Options – Ballinger and Stringybark Roads, Buderim

Project summary

Sunshine Coast Council is undertaking planning to improve the active transport network for walking and riding, connecting Sippy Downs and Buderim.

The vision for the Ballinger and Stringybark Roads Active Transport link project is to significantly increase the number of people walking and riding. This will be achieved through the creation of an inclusive walking and riding outcome for people of all ages and abilities, including safety improvements for riders continuing on road.

Options will consider the use of on-road, offroad, shared and separated cycling facilities.

The options analysis phase of this project is funded in partnership with the Department of Transport and Main Roads through the Cycle Network Local Government Grants Program.

Project timeline

Options analysis and concept design is scheduled for this financial year.

Further design is currently scheduled as per below timeframes:

Ballinger Road

- 2024/25 Design Commencement

Stringybark Road

- 2026/27 Design Commencement
